This course will address a number of topics related to human biology and evolution, with an emphasis on understanding the principles of biological evolution. Through a survey of evolutionary history and theory, basic genetics, nonhuman primate biology and behavior, paleontology, human prehistory, and modern human biology, variation, and adaptation, students will be better able to address the question: what is the place of humans in the natural world? Readings will include Relethford's *The Human Species: An Introduction to Biological Anthropology* (7th edition. McGraw-Hill) and a series of reserve articles on various topics. Students will be expected to complete a formal written assignment and three in-class exams.

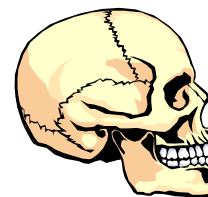
## Introduction To Archaeology

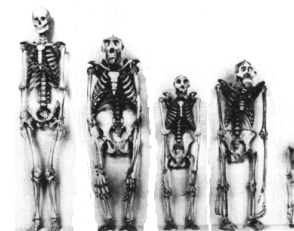
