Josh Cole Tree Planting Ceremony

Landscaping had the opportunity to work with a fine young man, Josh Cole, for two years. Friday afternoon, May 3, 2002, around 100 people (including family members and friends) along with friends from Landscaping, Grounds and Facilities had another opportunity to be able to honor Josh by planting a tree in his memory. Josh passed away this past December from complications of a heart condition. Dale Kadelbach, his supervisor, wrote the following in memory of Josh Cole.

JOSH

Roots: The roots of the tree are the foundation of Josh's life. They represent his family. They helped make him the person he was. They are often not seen but were a vital part of Josh's life and a vital part of this tree's life.

Trunk: The strongest and sturdiest part of the tree. This represents Josh's strong work ethic and his great personality. He was someone you could always count on.

Branches: This is where we notice the growth of the tree and it's where the tree will be the most helpful to us. The older the tree gets, the more branches it will have and the more shade it will provide for us. Each branch will represent an extension of Josh's hand that he put out to help someone and change someone's life. The more branches that grow on this tree are extensions of Josh's life through us in ways we

help others.

Leaves: The leaves are also vital parts of the survival of a tree for many years to come. I feel that each leaf on the tree represents a memory that we have of Josh and every spring when new leaves appear they will remind us of what a great friend and person he was.

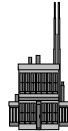

Familiar Faces in New Places

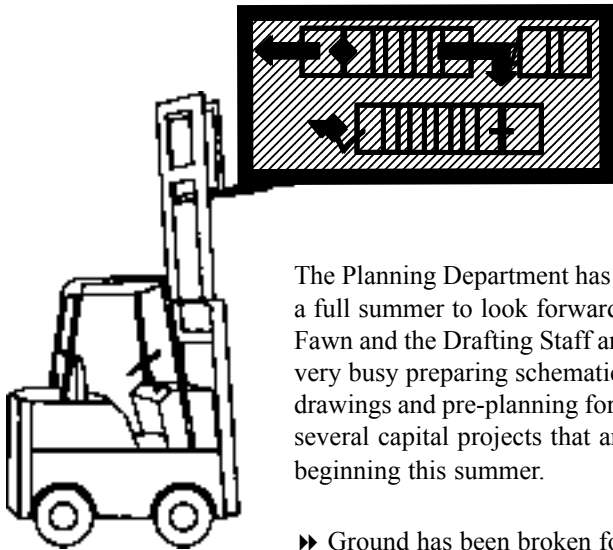

The Planning Department has a full summer to look forward to. Fawn and the Drafting Staff are very busy preparing schematic drawings and pre-planning for several capital projects that are beginning this summer.

▶▶ Ground has been broken for the new Hilton Garden Hotel located west of the RTC building. This project will move quickly with an ambitious opening of December 2002.

▶▶ The Energy Improvement projects are moving along quite well. Several buildings on campus, including Facilities, have already received new lights with more buildings to follow. This is just part of the total energy improvement work that will take place on campus using a \$4 million energy grant over a two year period. This work has to be completed by June 30, 2003.

▶▶ The new campus entry signs will soon be in place. The sign on the Johnstone-Hancock walkway was installed a couple weeks ago. This is a project the President is very interested in seeing completed.

▶▶ A building committee is in place to review proposals and select an architect for an \$8 million addition to EERC.

▶▶ Fawn has been working with the building committee for the renovation of the Memorial Union. Plans are to open bids for this work early fall.

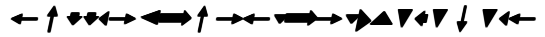
▶▶ An engineer has been selected to work on campus paving and parking lots this summer. The plan is to have a few more parking lots in place before school starts next fall. One place being considered is just west of Memorial Stadium in the grassy area along Columbia Road. The vacant lot east of the Carnegie Building will soon become a visitor's lot. This lot will have an attendant to answer questions visitors may have and will be a pay lot. Campus Road, where it bends between Upson and the Steam Plant, will be straightened out and the entrance/exit next to the Steam Plant will be changed.

▶▶ Work by a contractor will begin this week on a new entrance to the Medical School. This is approximately a \$300,000 project.

▶▶ We have been given a July 15, 2002 deadline to have all 1997 flood restoration work and paperwork completed. The only two projects remaining at this time are the completion of the sewer restoration and steam line replacement. Both projects should be finished within the next month.

▶▶ The Planning Department would like to welcome its newest team member, Sara Peters. Sara has accepted the position previously held by Jennifer Arends. Sara is new to the Campus so please stop by and introduce yourselves to her.
