GRAND FORKS, N.D. — Raleigh, N.C. native Peter Bruce, is interning as a news reporter with *Studio One*, a television show produced by staff and students at the University of North Dakota. He recently received second place in the North Dakota Professional Communicators contest for a news story explaining the transition process of towns that are synchronizing their traffic light system.
